St John Ambulance Australia (NSW) is holding a Customer Information Session at their **Surry Hills branch on Monday April 10, 2006** to explain the changes to CPR protocol.

The new protocol, which St John began teaching on Monday 3 April, 2006, was introduced by the Australian Resuscitation Council in March.

The changes aim to make CPR easier to learn and perform. It is also hoped that more frequent chest compressions will lead to more lives saved.

“While the current method of CPR is still valid, the new changes aim to make CPR easier to learn and easier to perform in an emergency situation. The important thing for people to remember is that by giving CPR you could help save someone’s life,” said Robyn Galwey, General Manager for Training, St John Ambulance (NSW) Australia.

The new protocol will be implemented Australia-wide over the next six to twelve months.
