The vehicle, donated by the Taiwanese Chamber of Commerce in April, has received the address-finding gadget on 8 August.

According to Colin Lott, Greater Metropolitan Region Superintendent, the help of local businesses is very important for the continuity of the high-standard services St John provides in the community.

"The GPS will optimize the time it takes for our volunteers to get to the events where they provide first aid. It will also help them to faster locate serious incidents where they are required to assist", Mr Lott said.

Bret Quinn, owner of the store, who presented the GPS device, believes that St John volunteers are vital to the local communities around the country.

"They give up their spare time to provide first aid at major and small community events.

"We are happy St John and its volunteers. Without them, many of those events would simply not be able to happen", he said.

In 2008, when St John Ambulance celebrated its 125 years of service in Australia, over 4,000 volunteers provided more than 450,000 hours of voluntary service across the state in the areas of first aid, early literacy, immunisation and ophthalmic care.
